service would be impossible as the number of young people is too high to make a delay in military service feasible.

Also present at the meeting was Foreign Minister Nikos Christodoulides, who said the government is working on finding a solution with British authorities.

He said a tally of students registered at British universities or wishing to attend them in the future will be carried out electronically to have a clear

picture of the number that will be affected by the increase in fees.

Christodoulides added the ministries will inform the head of the House education committee on developments and contacts with British officials.

MPs suggested replacing the loans from Student Finance England, with loans from the government for students studying in the UK. Commenting on the matter, Christodoulides said it is not one of his ministry's authorities, but if it were

to happen loans would also need to be made across the board for all Cypriot students here and abroad.

Criticising the government, main opposition Akel MP, Andreas Kakkalios said: "The government was late in reacting [to this issue]."

He added the tuition fees rising and the end of access to the student finance loans "has turned everything on its head".

In statements to CyBC on Tuesday, Christodoulides said he discussed the issue with UK

Minister of Europe Wendy Morton and his counterpart Dominic Raab over the weekend.

He said both ministers agreed to see what arrangement could be made for Cypriot students.

"It is important we will continue [to discuss with the UK] in the hopes of having a positive result," he said.

Christodoulides added the issue is not part of EU negotiations for Brexit, and they will have to discuss the matter bilaterally.

The current decision made by

the UK only applies for English universities at present. No announcements have been made about Scottish, Welsh, and Northern Irish universities. So far, Scottish universities have a policy of charging no fees or vastly reduced fees, depending on the course, to EU students.

The UK decision has already sparked concerns among Cypriot students. Fees could rise from £9,250 a year to above £20,000 for the social sciences, above £30,000 for science courses and £40,000 for medicine.

Concerns after flights begin from Turkey to the north

One man went straight to barber's for a haircut

CONCERNS were raised on Wednesday after the first two flights from Turkey arrived in the north when a passenger rushed to get a haircut straight out of the airport instead of self-isolating.

According to Turkish Cypriot daily *Yeni Duzen*, the man, who arrived in the north on board one of the two flights, went to a barbershop in downtown Nicosia for a haircut right after leaving the airport.

The daily quotes an employee of the barber shop saying they refused to serve the man after realising he had just arrived from abroad. He said the man got angry and offered to show them his negative coronavirus test certificate, but the

barber shop staff said that according to what they heard, passengers ought to self-isolate for a few days after arrival.

The daily reported that this incident raised concerns.

Passengers arriving from countries in category A are required to present a negative coronavirus test certificate not older than 72 hours, however people arriving from these countries but travelling via Turkey will be subject to the same rules which apply for arrivals from countries under category B.

Passengers from category B countries, have to present a negative coronavirus test and have to take a second test upon arrival. They also need to sign a declaration stating that until the second test results are ready, they will remain at their

residence or hotel. The test results of passengers are expected to be ready within four hours.

According to media reports in the north, one flight arrived from Turkey at 2.30am and the other at 8am, transferring 380 passengers in total. Eleven of the

passengers on board the first flight have been placed in quarantine since they arrived from the US, Brazil, Russia, Iran and the UK, that are not on categories A and B which include countries safer than the rest as regards the coronavirus outlook.

Yeni Duzen also reported that a passenger who was on the second plane and who was found to be from one of the risky countries in group C would be sent back after refusing to be quarantined for 14 days.

The same daily also reported that two ferries with around 180 passengers also arrived at the Kyrenia port from Mersin, Turkey.

Phone mast set on fire in Limassol

A PHONE mast and a telecommunications installation were set on fire overnight in Limassol, police said. According to police, the first fire at the installation in Palodia shortly after midnight was spotted by a member of the public who alerted the authorities.

A fire engine was sent to the scene, but the blaze had extinguished on its own.

Investigations showed it had been set deliberately.

The second incident happened in the same area at around 3.45am when a mobile phone antenna near the Spyros Kyprianou sports centre was set ablaze. In recent months, in Limassol, a number of incidents of arson and attempted arson on mobile phone antennas has taken place.

Authorities to screen army recruits

HEALTH authorities will conduct 1,000 tests for coronavirus on conscripts joining the national guard this month, it was announced on Wednesday.

The decision was made by the cabinet following a proposal by Health Minister Constantinos Ioannou.

The tests will be random and will be spread across all recruitment centres. Priority will be given to those who had not undergone testing during an education ministry programme that screened 20,000 students and school personnel.

The logistics will be assumed by the defence ministry in cooperation with the labs that will participate in the process.
